<p>Like you, I've lived a New Jersey life. Mary Pat and I have been blessed with the opportunity to raise four wonderful children here, counting on the fact that some day they will also call New Jersey their home. But today, we're all struggling to make ends meet and there isn't any relief in sight. We're facing our highest unemployment rate in 32 years, the highest tax burden in the country, and quality jobs are leaving our state without any indication they'll ever return.</p> <p>We've watched for too long as politician after politician has promised the world, only to disappoint by failing to deliver any results. Then we'll cut taxes across the board. We've been paying too many taxes, only to see our hard-earned dollars wasted over and over again. We can create long-term, quality paying jobs by investing in our natural resources and focusing on making New Jersey the leader in manufacturing renewable energy. I will cut red tape to make it easier for businesses to come back to our state and bring their jobs with them. I'll bring back our cities by improving public safety and attracting new business to our downtowns. Most importantly, if this is finally going to be action, and not just talk, I'll change the way Trenton operates from the outside in.</p> <p>As your former U.S. Attorney, I faced a lot of opposition saying I couldn't combat corruption in New Jersey. We proved everyone wrong by putting corrupt Republican and Democrat officials behind bars and saving countless taxpayer dollars from waste, fraud and abuse. I knew we could be successful because standing up to the special interests in our state is the right thing to do. Currently, students with computers excel, while those without them provide the excuse for low academic standards. Counties are obsolete, gerrymanders, inefficient and the primary source of political corruption.</p> <p>Trusts should be taxed on wealth, not income, and the proceeds used to create competitive venture capital pools for new industries.</p> <p>Internet purchases must pay sales tax. The two-tiered tax system is killing commercial real estate, which pays local property taxes.</p> <p>Government needs to be open more hours on more days, like private business. New sources of revenue are needed. We will sell money-losing NJ Transit to private carriers and create a comprehensive public transportation system. Every major traffic jam bottleneck in New Jersey is on a road with little or no public transit or at a toll booth. Government's only legitimate purpose is to enforce your rights, rights which are guaranteed by the state and federal constitutions. The state government is ill-equipped to make decisions about your children's education, health care, auto insurance, how to construct your home, your working conditions and salary, your sex life, ad infinitum. These matters should be returned to individual control so that you will be able to make the best decisions for you and your family without government interference.</p> <p>Here are some specifics:</p> <p>TAXES</p> <p>New Jersey's broad-based taxes are out of control. We are drowning in a sea of property taxes, income taxes, and sales taxes. We need to move away from these broad-based taxes in favor of user fees. A user fee is simply a fee paid for a service that is actually used. Funding services in that manner will result in some services being performed by the private sector rather than by government. That will make government smaller, and enable us to cut those taxes. It will also give individuals the power to save money by not paying for services they don't want or don't need. The rate of the income tax can be stepped down in tandem with each reduction in the size of government until that tax vanishes. Then we can get to work reducing the sales tax.</p> <p>MARIJUANA LEGALIZATION</p> <p>This is an issue of personal freedom. Whether or not marijuana is good for anyone is irrelevant. Every adult should have the right to make his or her own choices as to what to ingest—be it alcohol, marijuana, nicotine, or chery pie.
